The Wanda Gag home here is one such historical place. Her family was artistic; her father designed the family home. Wanda was an American author, printmaker, translator and illustrator. She is well known for her book, Millions of Cats, which she wrote and illustrated.

The Gag family house is an historical landmark and a work of art. For the quilters in our Sognefjordlag group, New Ulm has three quilting shops to choose from (see New Ulm Tourism booklet). Another landmark to check out on your own (perhaps Saturday afternoon on your way home) is the August Schell Brewing Company and the Schell Mansion Gardens. These public gardens are free. When our stemne ends at noon on Saturday, you can choose from a variety of restaurants in New Ulm for lunch. Some of the many options are Lola-An American Bistro, 209 Pub & Grill, Perkins, Main

Jiang House (Chinese), Plaza Garibaldi (Mexican) and many more.

Other points of Interest: the Glockenspiel, Minnesota Music Hall of Fame and Prince's large guitar out front, Defenders Monument, German-Bohemian Immigrant Monument, Governor Lind House, Hermann Monument, Kiesling House, Martin Luther College (WELS), various city parks, and a statue of Wanda Gag in front of the New Ulm Public Library.
